Greetings from your Locum

A week ago I lost one of our house keys and I wasn't quite sure where I had lost it. I thought I had it when I came to the church but I wasn't sure. So Jan and I set about looking for it. First we searched all my pockets, then all Jan's pockets just in case she had it and not me. Then I searched the car while Jan searched the house and every drawer, cupboard and even every bin just in case it had accidentally been put there. We searched high and low. I even came back to the church and searched the office, the hall and the Session Room but the key was not to be found until Monday night when Jan saw it pinned to the church notice board. So our grateful thanks to the person who found it and kindly put it there for us to find.

In John's Gospel we read that two of John the Baptisers disciples were asked a question by Jesus, 'What do you seek?' Which wasn't a question about a lost key but about something much more important. Jesus was asking what they wanted from him. Some translations of this question have, 'What do you want?' or more accurately, 'What are you looking for?' However, I prefer, 'What do you seek?' because it has about it more of an urgency and seriousness than the other translations.

Andrew, one of the men, and his companion were serious in their search. They had thought that John the Baptiser was the one they were looking for but he had pointed them to Jesus, the 'Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world.' Recognising how serious they were in their search Jesus asked what they sought. In answer to that question Andrew and his companion said, 'Rabbi, where are you staying?' Which seems a strange response but apparently in that time it was normal to ask a Rabbi where he was staying so that seekers could go to his home to talk and learn and discover new things. So the two asked Jesus where he lived and he replied, 'Come and you will see.' They went with Jesus and talked with him and listened to him and found what they sought in him.

By the time you read this we will be in the season of Lent and traditionally this is a time of fasting when people give things up. It is also a time for study, reflection and prayer in the weeks before Easter and at the start of Lent Jesus' question is still relevant, 'What do you seek?' There are many answers to that question. Perhaps Lent can be a search for a deeper understanding of Scripture, or for a deepened prayer life, maybe a longing for a more peaceful spirit and a greater awareness of the presence of God. Perhaps a search for a deeper meaning in the confusion of our modern world. 'What do you seek?' Whatever we seek John's Gospel reminds us that we will find the answer in Jesus Christ, our Lord. It is by spending time with him that we too can see more clearly, learn new things, gain understanding and discover the deeper meaning of faith and life. So this Lent let us all follow the example of Andrew and his



companion and spend more time at the Master's feet.

'When he (John the Baptiser) saw Jesus passing by he said, "Look, the Lamb of God!"
When the two disciples heard him say this, they followed Jesus. Turning round, Jesus saw them following and asked, "What do you want?"
They said, "Rabbi, where are you staying?"
"Come", he replied, "and you will see."

### Meat Free Monday

The recipe here is taken from "The Meat Free Monday Cookbook" hope you enjoy it.



Ale and Puff Pastry Pie

100g. margarine, - 2 large bunches spring onions with the bottom 7cm chopped, - 550g small chestnut mushrooms, cut into 5mm pieces, - 1 tablespoon cornflour, - ½ teaspoon yeast extract, - 300 -350ml light ale, - 210g ready rolled puff pastry, organic milk or soya milk.

Preheat oven to 200\*C/ gas mark 6.

Melt 50g margarine in a large non-stick frying pan. Sauté the chopped spring onions briefly. Add the chestnut mushrooms to the pan. Continue to sauté for 5 minutes until starting to colour, stirring to prevent sticking.

Remove from the heat and sprinkle with the cornflour. Once back on the hob, add the yeast extract and ale. Cook for a further 5minutes or until the mushrooms begin to soften. Use more ale if the mixture seems too dry.

Divide the mixture into four small soufflé/ceramic pie dishes, then cut out four pastry circles to place on top, leaving some room to rise. Brush with milk or soya milk and make a small hole in the top to let the steam escape. Bake for 20minutes until golden.
